Dear Consultee,

The Council undertook formal consultation on a proposal to reduce the capacity of the primary phase at Abertillery Learning Community by closing the Roseheyworth Road Campus in Abertillery.

At the Council's Cabinet meeting held on 30 April 2026, Cabinet resolved to proceed with the Council's preferred option, as outlined below:

To reduce the capacity of the primary phase, which forms part of Abertillery Learning Community, from 980 to 770, by closing the Roseheyworth Road Campus. Pupils will be relocated to the remaining campuses (Six Bells Campus and Tillery Street Campus), with full implementation by September 2027.

The Statutory Notice marks the start of the formal objection period. Should anyone wish to make a statutory objection, this may be done within 28 days of publication of the Statutory Notice, i.e. by Wednesday 3 June 2026.
