Step into Health

The Health Board are also in the process of agreeing to sign up to the 'Step into Health' programme to ensure we recognise the transferable skills and cultural values that Armed Forces personnel have developed, and how these skills and values are compatible with working in the NHS. We are also planning to sign up to this on Reserve Forces day in June.

HMF Education Support Officer

This is an MOD grant funded post, established to ensure that Service Children within our schools are not disadvantaged by mobility or deployment.

Part of my role involves working with schools to raise awareness of the needs of Service children and if needed provide advice and support to put in place the best possible interventions. This could include supporting schools to make successful bids to obtain grants for educational resources, running of clubs, ELSA and Thrive support.

I can signpost schools/families to additional support, arrange social opportunities for service families/children, work directly with children to provide a pastoral provision as required. Furthermore in the longer term I can provide training within schools so there is ongoing support in the future so all Service children reach their full potential.

Updates from your local authority

Blaenau Gwent

Blaenau Gwent Council and partners representing Gwent's Armed Forces community came together at a special opening ceremony of the new Jack Williams Gateway Bridge that towers above the A465 at Brynmawr.

The Council's Armed Forces Champion, Councillor Brian Thomas, attended the official opening ceremony alongside councillors representing the Nantyglo and Brynmawr Wards and representatives of the local armed forces community.

Decorated four times for his bravery during World War One, local Blaenau Gwent man John Henry Williams – better known as Jack – was born in Nantyglo in 1886. He was awarded the Victoria Cross for single-handedly saving his company and an entire nearby village from almost certain destruction in October 1918. The Welsh Government Deputy Minister for Economy and Transport unveiled the new Jack Williams Gateway in front of 12 members of Jack's family.

Blaenau Gwent council recently applied for and received the Defence Employer Recognition Bronze Award for demonstrating support to the local Armed Forces community. The council is currently in the process of applying for the Silver Award so we hope to update you about the progress of that application soon!

Monmouthshire

HMS Monmouth march in freedom parade.

One hundred and twenty-two members of the ship's company of Type 23 frigate HMS Monmouth received a warm Welsh welcome as they marched through their namesake town, exercising their rights to the freedom of the town.

Led by the Band of the Royal Marines, the sailors from HMS Monmouth began their march from the ancient historical Monnow Bridge with their 'drums beating, flags flying and bayonets fixed'. Hundreds of well-wishers lined the streets, clapping and cheering as the crew proudly marched by.

The ship's Commanding Officer, Commander William King was delighted by the warm welcome received today. He said: "I take great pride in my Ship and the name it bears. But what is more important to me are the men and women that serve in it with me."



In his welcome the Mayor said: "We first bestowed the freedom of the town to HMS Monmouth in 2003 and since then our ties have gone from strength to strength, and I am sure over the coming years the ties will become even stronger."

Newport

HMF Education Support – Newport City Council and Monmouthshire County Borough Council

At Newport we've been reviewing our HR policies relating to the Armed Forces community. We have revised our Reservist policy and introduced a guaranteed interview scheme for the Armed Forces community. The new scheme means that Reservists, Cadet Force Volunteers, Veterans and military spouses are guaranteed interviews for council jobs if they meet the essential requirements for the post.

Newport's Public Services Board (PSB) met at the city's Raglan Barracks in March to strengthen links with 104 Regiment and support the Armed Forces Covenant. Captain Matthews presented to the Board which included the council, health board, Fire and Rescue, Police, social housing landlords, Natural Resources Wales, Probation, the voluntary sector, further and higher education, and Newport Live. It identified opportunities for working more closely together. In April, our new HM Forces Education Support Officer, Emma Ashmead, joined us. Emma is supporting Service children in education across Newport and Monmouthshire.

forces champion Cllr Alan Jones, the Gwent Police cadets and the local ward members.

Cllr Davies said: "I'm really happy about how the ceremony went. The community really came together, and it was great seeing pupils from Blaenavon Primary Heddlu Bach getting involved too. You can see the benches as you pass the main road, so I'm hoping that people will stop to take a look at them and reflect on the fallen."

Army Medical Services Reserve

203 (Welsh) Field Hospital is part of the Army Medical Services (AMS) Reserve which provides vital support to the Regular Army and is one of 10 regionally recruited Field Hospitals around the UK.

We are looking for healthcare professionals drawn from most occupational areas throughout Wales who will have a unique opportunity to expand their existing skills and experience. The AMS Reserve will help develop confidence, leadership and communication skills. It is a spare time or part time career which runs alongside your NHS career.

The AMS Reserve selection criteria takes into account the value of professional qualifications, so a wide range of people are eligible to join, for most professions the maximum entry age is 50 and for some specialisms up to 55. You can also join if you are studying to be a doctor, nurse or allied health professional. The unit has deployed twice to Afghanistan in 2008 and 2013 and individuals have also deployed to Iraq, the Balkans and Sierra Leone.

Annual training is varied and incorporates military, military medical and adventurous training as well as the opportunity for representative sports. In the last few years the unit has been on its Annual Collective Training to Germany, the USA and Gibraltar.

104th Regiment

Army Reserve

104th Regiment Royal Artillery (the Welsh Borderers) is part of the Army Reserve which provides vital close combat support to the Regular Army and is one of 3 Royal Artillery Reserve Light Gun Regiments around the UK and the only Light Gun Regiment in Wales. The Regiment delivers as part of its ceremonial role, six Royal Salutes in Cardiff each year.

There are many opportunities for people to have a varied and interesting career in the Regiment, from a Gunner operating the L118 light gun, being a forward observer in the front line, observing enemy targets and bringing in fire support to being a communications specialist ensuring that everyone has the right information and communications around the battlefield. You can also join the regiment in non-artillery roles, you can be a Combat Medic, Human Resource Specialist, Logistics Specialist or Chef. The Army Reserve will help develop confidence, leadership and communication skills. It is a spare time or part time career which runs alongside your civilian career.

The Reserve selection criteria takes into account the value of professional qualifications, so a wide range of people are eligible to join, for most professions the maximum entry age is 50.

The Regiment has deployed Battery's and individuals to all theatres operationally, home and aboard, since its formation. These include Op TELIC and Op HERRICK in the middle East, Op TOSCA (UN Cyprus) Op ISMAY (NATO summit) and Op OLYMPICS (2012 Summer Olympics). A new 24-hour Gateway to help veterans access the support they need quickly and easily as they transition from military to civilian life launched 20th June 2017.

Backed by £2 million from the Ministry of Defence's Covenant Fund, Veterans' Gateway is designed to help former Servicemen and Women of all ages and backgrounds navigate their new lives as civilians. From advice on housing and finance to help with health concerns, the Gateway will bring together the vast range of charities and support on offer, guiding veterans directly to the help they need, when and where they need it.

The new 24-hour online chat, phone, and text message service brings the Armed Forces support community together in a single place for the first time – delivered by a Royal British Legion-led consortium with Poppyscotland, Combat Stress, Connect Assist, The Ministry of Defence and SSAFA, the Armed Forces Charity.

The service centre, based in Nantgarw near Cardiff, is manned partly by
